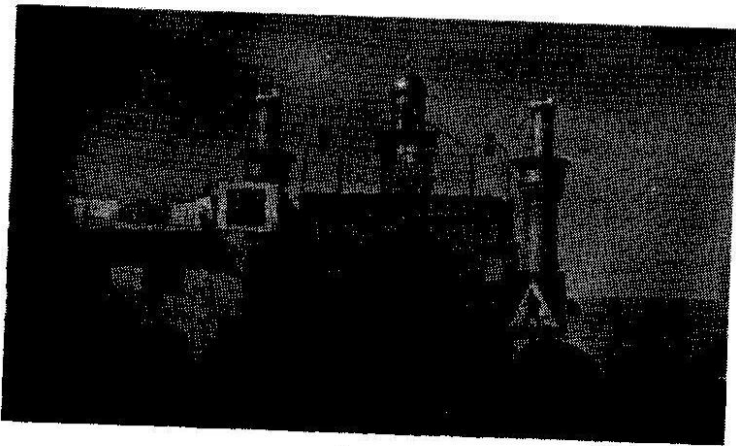

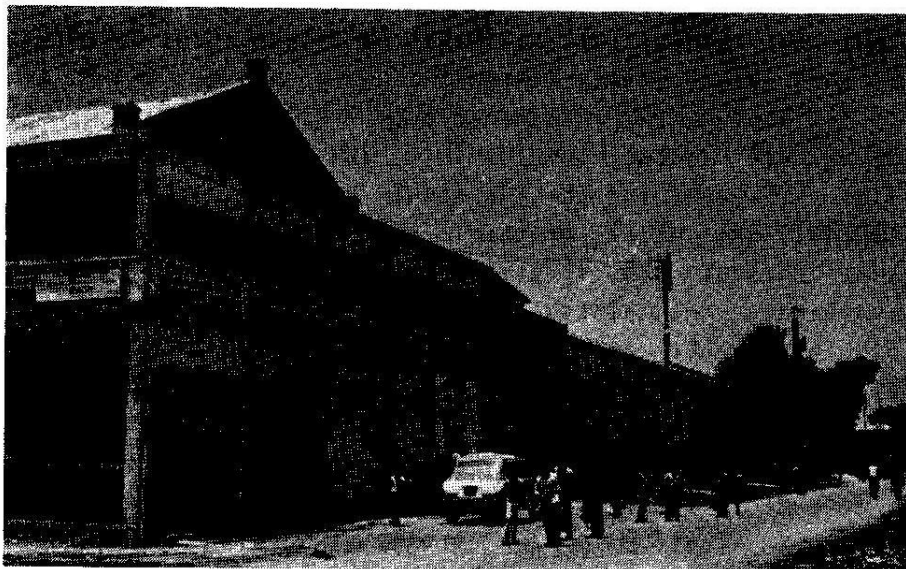

THE TRI-ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE TERRITORIAL COUNCIL—MADAGASCAR

As arranged by the Vice-Chairman of the Federation, Alhaj Abdulrasul A. Lakha, when he visited Tananarive in July, 1978, the Territorial Council of Madagascar convened their conference in October, 1978. The Chairman of the Federation, Alhaj Mulla Asgherali M.M. Jaffer, accompanied by the Vice Chairman and Mr. Amirali Haji Mohamedali Meghji flew to Tananarive on 16th Oct, 1978 to attend the session and visit the Jamaats. Upon arrival at Tananarive Airport, they were met by Haji Mohamedali Valli, the then Chairman of the Territorial Council and other leading members of the Jamaat. Haji Mohamed G. Dhirani, Chairman of Dar es Salaam Jamaat, Haji Mohamedali Sheriff and Haji Mohamed Rafiq G. Somji joined the delegation from Tanzania after a week.

The Conference was scheduled to meet on the 27th Oct., 1978 in Tananarive. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and Mr. Amirali Haji Mohamedali Meghji travelled to Majunga and Marovay, before the meeting. In Majunga, our Jamaat is well organised. Maulana Syed Sadiq Ali Shah Saheb is the resident priest. An evening Madressa supervised by our own young members is run twice a week. The Jamaat has its own Printing Press lucratively managed by enthusiastic members. Accompanied by the President of Majunga Jamaat, Haji Razahusein Dharamsi and his colleagues, the delegation inspected the Territorial Council property. This comprises of eight flats, two shops and two warehouses. During his visit in 1965, Marhum Alhaj Mohamedalibhai Meghji, the then Chairman of the Federation, had raised a fund in Madagascar for this investment.



The property of Territorial Council of Madagascar is situated in a prominent area of Majunga township.

After a brief stay in Marovay the delegation returned to Tananarive for an onward journey to Tulear and Morondava. In Tulear, the Vice Chairman, Alhaj Abdulrasul A. Lakha, recited a Majlis in Gujarati, and then delivered an illuminating talk on the current communal affairs. He also attended a question and answer session where he ably dealt with several important questions asked by the members.

The Conference, attended by delegates from almost all the Jamaats, dwelt upon important matters concerning our community in Madagascar. Besides the transaction of business, it served to revive the dormant Territorial Council and rekindle the flame of enthusiasm and zeal in the members. The Chairman of the Federation presented a scroll of citation to Haji Mohamedali Valli, the retiring Chairman of the

Territorial Council, expressing deep appreciation for his continued services to the Territorial Council since its inception. Tananarive Jamaat was thanked for the excellent arrangements they had made for the meeting and for the facilities provided to the guest delegates.



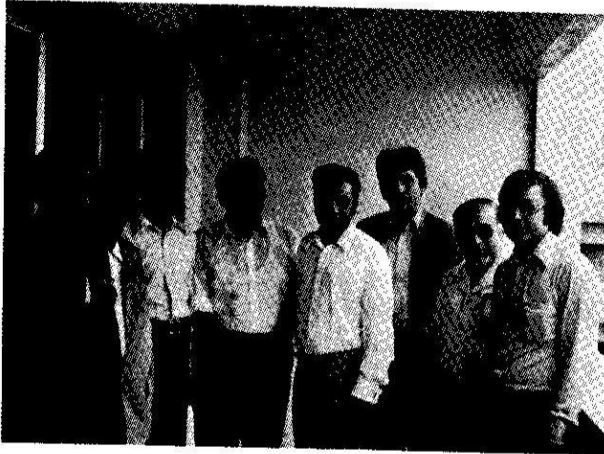

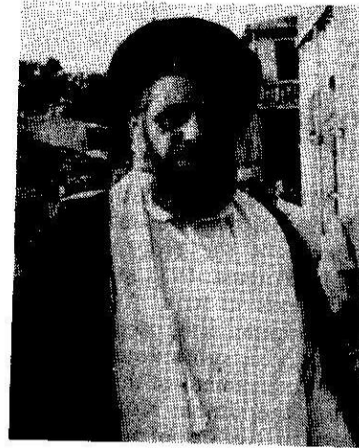

KRAFT CHEESE CONTAINS SWINE ENZYME!

The following is a reply that Sister Yasmeen (Deborreh Lewis) received from Kraft Consumer Service in response to her enquiry about the cheese ingredients. For the benefit and knowledge of our readers we are reproducing it here. We feel that the information contained in this letter deserves comment from the knowledgeable persons in Islamic Shariah.

Dear Ms. Lewis,

Thank you for your recent phone call inquiring about the ingredients in Kraft Natural Limburger Cheese. Following is a list of ingredients included in our Limburger natural cheese: pasteurised milk, cheese cultures, salt, enzymes and calcium chloride.

You also inquired whether this product contains any animal derivatives. Many of our cheese products do contain a coagulated enzyme derived from either beef or swine. The process of changing fluid milk into cheese consists of coagulating the milk by one of

two commonly used methods, each resulting in cheese having distinct characteristics. The most common method of coagulating milk is by the use of an enzyme preparation, rennet, which traditionally was made from the stomach of veal calves.

Since the consumption of calves for veal has not kept the pace with the demand for rennet for the preparation of cheese, the world has developed a distinct shortage of this enzyme. Consequently, a few years ago it became a common practice to "mix the rennet extract from calves' stomachs with pepsin enzyme derived primarily from the stomach of swine". These enzymes convert the fluid milk into a semi-solid mass as one of the steps in the manufacture of cheese. This mixture of calf rennet extract and pepsin extract is quite commonly and widely used within the United States and other parts of the world for cheese making. A more recent development in this area has been the use of enzymes derived from the growth of pure cultures of certain forms of mold and bacteria. These are termed microbial rennets and are quite satisfactory for the production of certain types of cheese. However, each of the microbial coagulating agents has proved to have certain limitations and therefore, use has not grown rapidly as first anticipated.

With these facts in mind, it is almost impossible for us to assure you that any cheese product which you

might purchase from Kraft is absolutely free of animal derived enzymes.

Thank you once again for your telephone call and we hope we have answered your questions about Kraft Natural Limburger Cheese.

EDUCATIONAL FILM ON THE QUR'AN LAUNCHED

The first international premiere of 'The Holy Qur'an', a film depicting the religious, scientific and aesthetic aspects of the Holy Qur'an was held in London on 21st August, 1978 at the British Academy of Film and Television Arts.

The twenty-minute film prepared in English and Arabic versions, is a sumptuous tour of some of the best calligraphic specimens of the Qur'an as well as its evolution from the simple Kufic to modern Naskh. Being the very first effort of its kind, the film is extremely successful in a powerful yet serene and beautiful treatment of an essentially abstract subject.

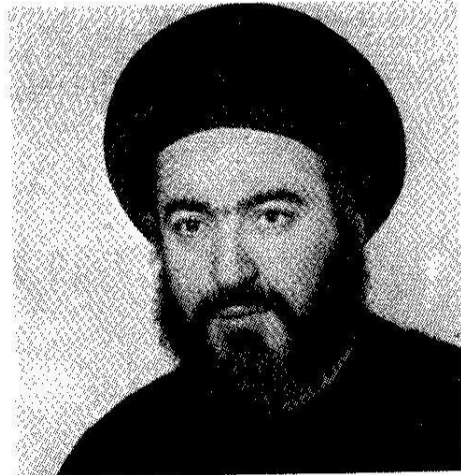
The idea of the film was conceived by Sheikh Sultan al-Qasimi, Ruler of Sharjah and its preparation was made possible through the interest and support of the U.A.A. President Sheikh Zayed. Credit for the success of the final effort goes to Dr. Ezzuddin Ibrahim, Cultural Advisor to the UAA President and a noted scholar in his own right, who has guided and improvised the filming of this unique topic. Dr. Ezzuddin who hosted the premiere said that Muslims had specialised in architecture, design and calligraphy as sublime art forms and Calligraphy was undisputably a great art.

The film will be shown on the third channel of the French TV and is available for distribution to TV and other audio-visual media both in the Muslim and non-Muslim world. Non-commercial users may buy a copy at around £400.

SHIA ACADEMY:

At the 13th Conference held in Dar es Salaam, it had been resolved that the Federation should explore the possibilities of establishing a Shia Academy for higher religious studies, in East Africa. Accordingly, the Secretariat contacted various institutions and Shia Ithna-Asheri scholars throughout the world, seeking their guidance and assistance towards such an establishment. We are glad to report that the idea was appreciated by most of the institutions and scholars abroad. However, the only quarter from which we received a firm response was Syria, where Hujjatul Islam Aqa Syed Hasan Shirazi Damazilluh is busy establishing a Hawza-e-Ilm, after dispersal in Najaf-Iraq.

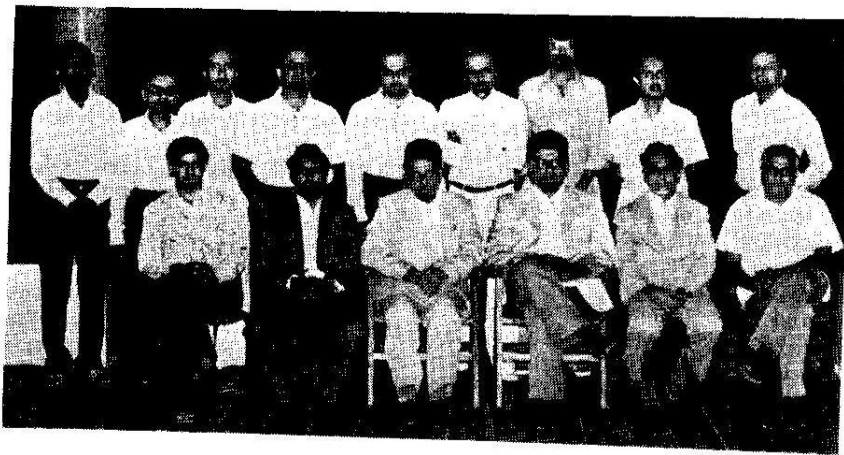
Aqa Shirazi sent his representative Siqatul Islam Sheikh Muhammad Ismail to Kenya for an on-the-spot survey of our activities. Sheikh Saheb was in Mombasa for a fortnight. He visited the Secretariat and obtained all the necessary information from the Chairman of the Federation, who had specially flown from Nairobi to meet him. Later, Sheikh Saheb visited Bilal Mission Madressas at the Coast. He was greatly impressed by the missionary undertakings of the mission, and made worthwhile suggestions towards making Tabligh work more organised and effective.

The Federation has requested for two Ulema, who must be fluent in Arabic, for conducting classes in advanced studies in Islamiyyat. Sheikh Saheb principally concurred with this idea of a modest beginning, and promised to convey our request to Aqa Shirazi. We have recently received a letter from Aqa Shirazi stating that he is seriously working on our proposal and will write to us as soon as he is able to recommend the required tutors.

The Mosque/Imambada complex built by Mehfile Murtaza, Karachi, was ceremoniously declared open by Haji Mustafa K. 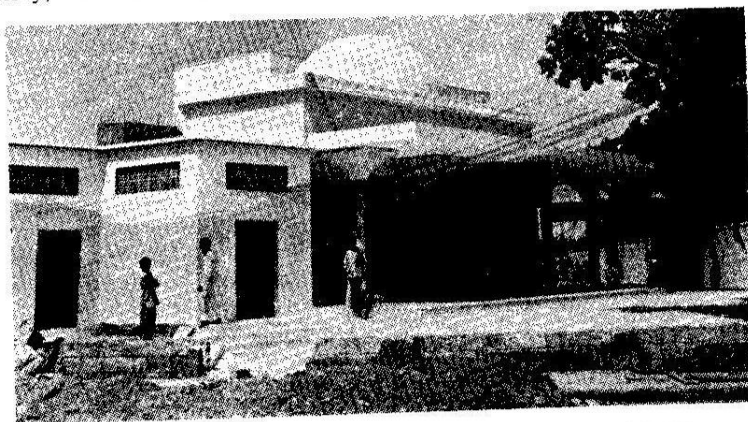
GUIDANCE FOR HAJ

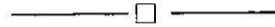
